Kitchens drawn for the house, not the catalogue.

Reeve & Co designs, draws, makes and installs hand-built bespoke kitchens for period townhouses, country rectories, village farmhouses and architect-designed new builds — made in our own Suffolk workshop and fitted by our own team, nothing sub-contracted.

A bespoke kitchen has to be drawn around the proportions of the room, the original fabric of the house and the way the household actually lives, which is joinery work, not unit planning. We spend time understanding routines, equipment and how a family moves through the space before a single drawing is started.

Every cabinet is made bench-by-bench in fine timbers and hand-finished, then scribed to the room on installation by our own fitters.

Where technology sets the tolerance, and hands set the quality.

We use CNC equipment alongside traditional machining to hold exact, repeatable tolerances — but every joint, drawer box and shadow gap is resolved by hand at the bench. We specify fine hardwoods — oak, walnut, sycamore, tulipwood — sourced from certified suppliers, with all painting and lacquering carried out in our own spray booth to a furniture-grade standard.

Longevity is our starting point for sustainability: a well-made kitchen can be repaired, refinished and adapted rather than replaced. Our workshop runs five EV charging points, biomass heating from our own timber offcuts, and water-based finishes throughout.

- Low-VOC, water-based paints and lacquers
- Five on-site EV charging points, biomass heating

Dovetailed drawer boxes, soft-close runners and quality hinges are fitted as standard — built for decades of daily family use, not a showroom photograph.

The Shaker Kitchen

A bespoke Shaker kitchen should feel calm, useful and permanent. We draw each kitchen for the room, then make the cabinetry in our Suffolk workshop with proper in-frame doors, considered proportions, hand-painted finishes and the level of detail expected in high-end residential joinery.

The word Shaker is used widely, but the difference is in the construction. A Reeve & Co Shaker kitchen is not a catalogue door placed into a standard carcass — the rails, stiles, frames, plinths, end panels, larders and island details are all drawn together, so the kitchen sits naturally within the architecture.

The Suffolk Kitchen

The Suffolk Kitchen is the kitchen most often asked of us: in-frame Shaker doors in solid tulipwood, hand-painted in a Farrow & Ball or Little Greene colour, walnut tall cupboards where the room invites them, stone or timber worktops, ironmongery in unlacquered brass or aged bronze. Quiet, generous, built to be used hard.

There is no stock answer to an old farmhouse, a listed townhouse, a barn conversion or a new house that wants the same calm. We measure properly, draw by hand and in CAD, and tune every line of cabinetry to the architecture rather than forcing a standard kitchen into place.

The Norfolk Kitchen

The Norfolk Kitchen is drawn for the scale of a Norfolk house — farmhouses, barn conversions, flint cottages on the coast, rectories inland. In-frame Shaker doors, painted by hand. Larders with marble cold shelves. Range cooker housings for an AGA, Everhot or Lacanche. Stone or oak worktops, fireclay sinks, brass and bronze ironmongery.

Norfolk kitchens often need to do two things at once: feel properly scaled for generous rooms while still being calm enough for everyday use. We draw the joinery with that balance in mind, giving the cabinetry enough width, depth and rhythm to look settled in larger spaces without becoming heavy.

The Farmhouse Kitchen

A farmhouse kitchen is a working room. Big sinks, big ranges, big tables. Painted timber, V-groove panels, honest hardware. We build farmhouse kitchens for farmhouses — drawn for how the room is already used, not styled to look the part. The detail comes from the joinery.

The point of a farmhouse kitchen is not to perform rustic charm. It is to support the daily traffic of the house: boots at the back door, pans on the range, flowers on the table, dogs underfoot and a sink that earns its keep. We begin with how the room works now, then refine the cabinetry, storage and finishes around it.

The Kensington Kitchen

The Kensington is our London style — drawn alongside architects and interior designers for townhouses, apartments and large private homes across London and the Home Counties. Veneered fronts, spray-finished cabinetry, handle-less detailing, integrated lighting. Made on the same workshop benches as our country kitchens, to the same standards.

A meaningful share of our London kitchen work comes through architects and interior designers, often as part of a larger fitted-joinery commission for the same client. We produce drawings to suit their working standards and contribute detail at coordination stage.

Utility & Boot Rooms

The best ancillary rooms are not afterthoughts. They remove noise, clutter and daily pressure from the kitchen, hall and living spaces, while still feeling like part of the same high-end joinery scheme.

A utility room has to deal with washing machines, drying space, cleaning stores, recycling, linen, coats, muddy boots and sometimes dogs. A boot room has to deal with the way people actually enter the house. We design these rooms as furniture-led joinery, not just as a row of cupboards — bench heights, peg rail positions and appliance ventilation all resolved before the workshop starts.

Modular & Freestanding Kitchens

Freestanding kitchen furniture is not a compromise when it is made properly. Islands, dressers, larder cupboards, sink stands and prep tables can be built as complete pieces of furniture, giving older houses and character rooms a softer, more collected feel.

A modular kitchen suits rooms where fixed runs would feel too heavy, where listed fabric needs to be respected, or where the client wants the kitchen to feel more like furniture than installation. Every piece can stand apart from the walls or combine with one fitted run where storage density is needed.

Essex Kitchen — A Family Kitchen

A client-direct commission: a full in-frame kitchen with a central island, a run of tall larder cabinetry and a separate utility room, designed around the house and the way the family really lives. Cabinets were planned around appliances, bins and storage so that everything has a considered home — deep drawers, pull-outs and dedicated provision for the things a family actually owns.

Every cabinet made bench-by-bench, and scribed to the room.

The cabinetry was hand-finished with solid-timber framing and well-made drawer boxes built for decades of use — dovetailed by hand, running on quality soft-close hinges and runners throughout. The island was sized to work both as a preparation space and a place to sit, with sightlines and proportions resolved on the drawing board before the workshop started.

How much does a bespoke kitchen cost?

Bespoke kitchens typically start around £25,000 for a full in-frame kitchen, scaling with size, island, larder and utility scope. Send a rough sketch or floor plan to sales@reeveandco.com for an indicative quote within days.

What's the process from enquiry to fitting?

Four stages: visit and survey, design drawings with cabinetry, elevations and finishes resolved, workshop making with samples you can approve in person, then fitting and aftercare by our own team.

How long does a bespoke kitchen take?

Lead times typically run 12–20 weeks in the workshop depending on scope and finish, plus the design stage. You get a clear programme before anything is made.

Do you fit the kitchen yourselves?

Yes. Design, drawings, making and installation are all done by our own team — nothing is sub-contracted.

Do you work with architects and interior designers?

Yes — a significant share of our kitchen work comes through design professionals. We work from RIBA-compatible drawings and produce our own shop drawings for approval before manufacture.

What deposit do you take?

Typically 30% on order, 40% at manufacture start, 30% on completion — set out clearly in your quote before anything is made.

Do you work on listed buildings and period properties?

Yes, regularly — including period-correct larders, panelling and joinery that respects original fabric and proportions.

Which areas do you cover?

We design, make and install across London, the Home Counties and East Anglia from our Suffolk workshop, with further afield by arrangement.

What timbers and finishes do you work with?

Oak, walnut, sycamore, tulipwood and ash, hand-painted or sprayed lacquer, all finished in-house in our own spray booth to a furniture-grade standard.

Is your joinery sustainable?

We use FSC- and PEFC-certified European hardwoods where available, finish everything in-house, and select low-VOC paints and lacquers throughout.

Can I commission just a larder or utility room?

Yes — a single fitted piece, an adjoining utility or boot room, or a full kitchen all work equally well for us.

Do you have a showroom?

A small showroom with a couple of kitchens, alongside our working workshop — open Monday to Friday, 8am–5pm, Mickfield, near Stowmarket, Suffolk.

How much is delivery and installation?

Free across mainland UK. Non-mainland and international projects are quoted separately.

Can you work to a fixed budget?

Yes — tell us the budget up front and we will design and specify to make the most of it, being clear about trade-offs along the way.
